- His last start was a solid third place finish behind fellow Hambletonian rivals Giveitgasandgo and Jake at the Meadowlands on July 29 in a \$15,000 open event.
- From five trips to the gate this season, the colt has yet to win, but has come home third on three occasions.
- Shake It Off Lindy was fifth in the \$183,280 William Wellwood Memorial final and fourth in the \$161,500 Stanley Dancer Memorial.
- He will start from post position four in the second elimination with Brett Miller in the sulky and is 20-1 on the morning line.
- He's just an honest, good horse," his trainer Frank Antonacci said. "He's never really gotten a spot where he's gotten a trip. I think he's the type of horse that if he trips out he could grab a big piece. Hopefully we make the final and get a good trip worked out and maybe surprise people or pick up a bunch of pieces."
- Antonacci, 33, is a graduate of Boston College with a degree in finance. He started training on a regular basis in 2006 and has won more than 500 races and nearly \$10 million in purses.
- He trained 2008 Hambletonian runner-up Crazed, who finished second to Deweycheatumhowe. Crazed, who won his Hambletonian elimination, was a multiple stakes-winner for Antonacci.

- Antonacci is the grandson of Guy “Sonny” Antonacci. Sonny and cousin Frank J. Antonacci, both enshrined in the Harness Racing Hall of Fame, were among family members that introduced the Antonacci name, as well as their Lindy Farms of Connecticut, to the sport. Sonny’s sons Frank and Jerry continue the tradition, along with Frank M. Antonacci.
- Antonacci also sends out the morning line favorite in the second elimination in International Moni (post five, 5-2, Scott Zeron).
- K R Breeding LLC consists of Antonacci, his father Frank and brother Gerald.
- The Antonacci family and/or its Lindy Racing have been involved in the ownership of five Hambletonian winners: Lindy’s Pride (1969), Speedy Crown (1971), Probe (1989), Harmonious (1990) and Victory Dream (1994).
- Brett Miller drove in his first Hambletonian in 2015 for Jimmy Takter with French Laundry and finished eighth. He piloted Love Matters in 2016, also for Takter and was seventh in the elimination.
- The Brett Miller breakout party launched into Phase 2 in 2015, finishing fourth in the Meadowlands driver standings, vaulting past 7,000 career wins and landing in the sport’s Top 10 money earners by posting his second straight \$7 million season.
- “Super Brett” also worked his way up the Grand Circuit ladder, getting calls from top trainers like Takter and won his first Breeders Crown with Pure Country. That Dan Patch Award winning two-and three-year-old pacing filly fashioned a perfect 10-for-10 season for Miller in 2015.
- Miller, a 43-year-old from Columbus, Ohio, was born into harness racing. His grandfathers A.J. Price and Clyde Miller both operated stables, his father Del S. Miller was a successful horseman, and his cousin is Hall of Fame driver Dave Miller. He has won 7,526 races and more than \$75 million in purse money. Last year, he won a Breeders Crown with Racing Hill, as well as the Adios, Messenger and Hempt Memorial.
- Miller has faced his share of adversity, including bad spills, which led to some personal medication issues, and turned out to be a series of events that completely turned his life around. In mid-2007, Miller received a one-year suspension. After being in a couple of bad accidents, he successfully battled addiction to pain medication and substance abuse, and credits trainer Dan Daley with his recovery. Miller also met his wife, Stacey, and they now have three young children.
- “It’s kind of a typical situation that athletes and people go through. There’s no doubt there can be an event or series of events that can turn your life around. During the year suspension I realized the thing that I loved the most was driving harness horses and that was taken from me. It was a big wake-up call. I went back to grooming horses for Dan Daley at the South Florida Training Center. He worked me to death. Dan made me appreciate what I had and how I lost it. He really helped me out.
